Master of Science in Nursing Administration

The Nursing Administration track prepares nurses to serve in administrative roles in healthcare settings and provide leadership in the profession. This program is designed to facilitate the integration and application of advanced administrative theory and skills. Course content includes system performance, organizational behavior, health policy, health law and ethics, resource management, and administrative issues. An administrative practicum experience in healthcare settings is selected relative to individual student interests and learning needs. The learning outcomes for the program are

1. Integrates knowledge from science and the humanities to provide nursing care to diverse populations
2. Utilizes organizational and systems leadership skills to deliver quality, safe patient care
3. Promotes the use of quality measures to create a culture of safety and to meet standards of care
4. Analyze and implement best evidence and standards of practice as a basis for clinical decisions
5. Uses patient care and information technology to improve patient outcomes
6. Intervenes at the system level to influence health care policy development
7. Communicates, collaborates and consults other health professionals to manage and coordinate care
8. Plans, delivers and manages clinical prevention and population-based health care
9. Provides an advanced level of indirect and direct nursing care interventions to improve health care outcomes for individuals, families and populations
