Are you sure you made your ideas clear? You need to remember that you may be as much a part of the problem as anyone else.

7. Go easy.

It is tempting to offer an immediate solution to the problem. Instead, listen to all points of view and acknowledge the other person or people involved so they know that their opinions have been heard.
