Method: Lectures, demonstrations, videos, A/V presentations, discussions, interactive games, improvisation, and viewings of live performances.

Super –Objectives: It has often been said that the theatre is the arena where humans attempt to make sense of their experiences, as individuals and as members of a community. This course will assist the beginning student, through a survey of important production techniques, a brief history of the western theatre, and a study of a handful of important plays-with a broad base of knowledge about the various forms of what we call theatre and to provide the student with critical tools for assessing the theatrical experience.

Course Requirements: There are 2 play critiques, 5 play quizzes, 2 mid- term like exams, a final cumulative exam and the students' full participation in classroom discussions, exercises, and group projects.

Play critiques will be due on the first class period after a production closes. All critiques must be 2-4 pages typewritten, 12 font, Times New Roman, 1 ¼ inch margins, doubled—spaced, free of spelling, grammatical and compositional errors. The critique should be a thoughtful analysis of the production in question and handed in on time. The specific criteria and subjects of these papers will vary depending on the production.

Exams and Quizzes: Exams/quizzes will take the form of one or a combination of the following: objective (multiple choice) and subjective (essay or short answer). The quizzes will cover the following required reading.
