COURSE TITLE: Developmental Writing: Fundamentals of Grammar

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course provides an intense overview/review of the basic elements of modern English usage. The course includes writing experience with attention to the basic mechanical and structural elements of the writing process. This course is offered to meet the need for a foundation in grammar and sentence structure. Students who do no score satisfactorily on the TSI will be required to take English 0301.

- b. Use punctuation and capitalization correctly, as evidenced by an objective assessment and an in-class writing sample;
- c. Join sentences together effectively, as evidenced by writing samples produced both in class and out of class:
- d. Utilize techniques for peer-editing and will employ them in the classroom in group activities;

- e. Compose effective sentences, as evidenced by satisfactory completion of in-class writing prompts; and
- f. Write paragraphs and in-class, timed writing assignments.

COURSE OUTLINE

This course provides a review of the foundations of good writing skills, beginning with the basic parts of speech, sentence structure, capitalization and punctuation, and concluding the successful paragraph and short essay development. The course prepares the student for the subsequent course, English 0302, or satisfactory mastery of the TSI requirement for English 1301. For a full semester outline, see the course calendar attached to this syllabus.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students in this class will be expected to complete the following requirements:

- a. Regular attendance at all class meetings;
- b. Completion of all assignments, homework, quizzes, papers, and in-class activities;
- c. Two objective examinations over the fundamentals of grammar;
- d. A minimum of four writing assignments as outlined in the course calendar; and
- e. A minimum of three hours for writing in the Student Success Center.

STUDENT PARTICIPATION

Class participation means interaction with other students and the instructor, not just presence in class. Class comments will reflect reading and honest consideration of the viewpoints of the other students. Students are expected to deal with one another and the instructor in a professional, courteous manner. Students are also expected to visit the Student Success Center for assistance with the development of their writing assignments. Attending success center sessions (at least three hours per semester) will be part of the final grade in this course.

METHODS OF EVALUATION

Students will be evaluated through the following: class attendance and participation, in-class quizzes and activities, two objective examinations, and a minimum of four writing assignments. Mandatory visits to the Student Success Center will be factored into each essay assignment as part of the grading scale.
